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A Chord Scale Approach To

The chord-scale system is a method of matching, from a list of possible chords, a list of possible scales. The system has been widely used since the 1970s and is "generally accepted in the jazz world today". However, the majority of older players used the chord tone/chord arpeggio method.

Chord-Scale Theory is an approach to improvising that relates chords to scales. The notes of a 13th chord can be rearranged as a 7-note scale. To determine chord-scales, identify key centers and chord functions through Roman numeral analysis.; Roman numerals can be related to mode numbers.

Chordal and arpeggio approaches are still superior, even if Miles and Evans thought otherwise. With the arp. method you only have to learn 4 notes and can use the same ones to solo over many various changes in Jazz, while introducing amazing tension and feel for interesting harmony. Learning chord scales is just antiquated.

Chord Scale Theory - Ed Saindon

The chord-scale approach is based on the idea that if a chord is diatonic to a scale, then that scale can be used as a source to derive melody on that chord. Using the chord-scale approach gives improvisers (especially less proficient ones) greater melodic and rhythmic mobility (i.e., they can improvise pitch sequences in eighth notes, triplets, sixteenth notes, etc.).

The most common pattern is to approach chord tones on beats one and three. This technique is one of the defining sounds of jazz improvisation or more specifically bebop and is one of the core concepts of “playing over the changes.” From Charlie Parker on, you see an abundant use of approach note patterns being used by most jazz musicians.

This greatly strengthens your mental perspective and overall theoretical concept.

Chord tone soloing is one of those things that either eludes guitarists, or they shy away from it in favor of the one-scale-fits-all approach. Chromatic Scale: A twelve note scale comprised of half steps that encompasses every note that you'll ever play. E F F# G G# A A# B C C# D D#. I begin with E because the outer two strings on the guitar are E strings, but the chromatic scale can begin on any note. There are 12 notes in the chromatic scale.
