Domain 4, together with Domain 1 - Planning and Preparation, represents the "behind the scenes" work associated with teaching. Through their skills in Domain 4, teachers demonstrate their commitment to high ethical and professional standards and seek to improve their practice.

Domain 4: Professional Responsibilities - Danielson ...

Danielson divides the complex activity of teaching into twenty-two components clustered into four domains of teaching responsibility: (1) planning and preparation, (2)the classroom environment, (3)instruction,and (4) professional responsibilities. These domains and their components are outlinedin a following table.

Domains 1 and 4 represent the “behind the scenes” work of teaching: essential for accomplished practice but not visible in the classroom. This means that a teacher’s skill in these domains must be demonstrated through artifacts, planning documents for Domain 1 and artifacts reflecting a teacher’s professionalism for Domain 4.
