The procedure begins with the drafting of a formal document, known as an Initial Writ, stating the basis of the irretrievable breakdown of the marriage/civil partnership. A copy will be sent to your spouse/partner who then has 21 days to seek independent legal advice and consider a response.

Actions for divorce in Scotland may be brought in either the Sheriff Court or the Court of Session. After the hearing, the Commissioner has 30 days to submit his report to the Court. The Commissioner will notify you and the Court once the report has been filed. You will receive a copy of this report. You may prepare and file your Final Decree of Divorce once you receive the Commissioner's Report. This Decree must re-allege all the basic information stated in the Complaint and order that the Divorce is granted in accordance with the Commissioner's recommendations.

A divorce can't move forward until the spouse who filed arranges to have the other spouse officially served with the divorce papers. In most states, there are several acceptable ways of doing this. One common method is to have the papers delivered by sheriff's officer -- at least in contested divorces where spouses can't agree on anything or if one of them doesn't want the divorce in the first place.

Is it Normal for the Sheriff to Come to the Home to ...

The fee for filing a case for divorce is currently \$225.00. You will also need either \$30.00 to have the Sheriff serve the Defendant, or \$7.00 to serve the Defendant by certified mail. If you are including a claim for "Resumption of Maiden Name," there may be an additional \$10.00 fee.
