At Mainamati the principle monument is the Shalban Vihara which is the main interest here. During Mr. Nalini Kanta Bhattasali's tour, he found several Buddhist sites including Shalban Vihara and reported his findings in his book Iconography of Buddhist and Brahmanical Sculptures in the Dacca Museum (1929).
