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Social learning theory was first proposed by Albert Bandura. It is a theory that "emphasizes the importance of observing and modeling the behaviors, attitudes, and emotional reactions of others," ("Social Learning Theory," n.d.). There are three main hypotheses of social learning theory. First, the theory assumes that people can learn by observing others (Cherry, n.d.).
