If you develop high blood pressure after 20 weeks of pregnancy but don't have protein in your urine or other key symptoms of preeclampsia, you'll be diagnosed with gestational hypertension, sometimes called pregnancy-induced hypertension (PIH).

Gestational hypertension: High blood pressure is noted in the latter part of pregnancy, but no other signs or symptoms of preeclampsia are present. Some women will later develop preeclampsia, while others probably have high blood pressure (chronic hypertension) before the pregnancy.

Potential Complication: Gestational Hypertension

Severe hypertension is defined as a blood pressure that is higher than 150/110. Sometimes women who usually have a normal blood pressure will have hypertension during pregnancy. This is one of the most common complications of pregnancy. It happens in 5% of all pregnancies and 10% of first pregnancies.

The Community Preventive Services Task Force (CPSTF) recommends exercise programs for pregnant women to reduce the development of gestational hypertension. Intervention Programs engage women in regular exercise from before their 16th week of pregnancy through birth.

The treatment of gestational hypertension follows a different set of guidelines than the treatment of general high blood pressure outside of pregnancy. The main goal of treatment in pregnant women is to prevent the development of more serious conditions like fetal growth restriction or

placental abruption.

Hypertensive disorders in pregnancy are a major cause of maternal, fetal and neonatal morbidity and mortality, both in developing and developed countries. Hypertension is the most common medical problem in pregnancy, complicating up to 15% of pregnancies and accounting for about a quarter of all antenatal admissions in the UK.

1.4.8 For women with gestational hypertension whose blood pressure is lower than 160/110 mmHg after 37 weeks, timing of birth, and maternal and fetal indications for birth should be agreed between the woman and the senior obstetrician. [2010, amended 2019]

Gestational hypertension HTN first diagnosis during pregnancy, after 20 weeks of gestation; it usually resolves within six weeks post-partum. Gestational HTN is considered a form of secondary HTN. Pre-existing hypertension plus superimposed gestational hypertension with proteinuria
