Response Journals record student feelings, responses, and reactions to reading texts. This active learning strategy encourages students to think deeply about the materials they read and to relate this information to their prior knowledge and experiences.

Response Journal - Reading Educator

Students respond for approximately five minutes in a writing journal to a question posted in class prior to reading. Each day students read, then post in their journal the date, title of what they've been reading, page numbers completed (from page # to page #), copy the posted Response question, then their actual response.

Student Reading Response Journal Questions

A Reader Response can be a personal reaction to the text, or it can be a more impersonal analysis of the ideas and writing in the texts. In a Reader Response essay, you can talk about one or more of the following: Your feelings about the topic. Your thoughts about what the author said.

To write a journal response to a book, start by writing a summary of the book to explain the author's main points, and provide 1 to 2 quotes from the text to support your analysis. Then, give your commentary on the book, explaining why you agree or disagree with what the author says.
